Teacher's Guide – Cultural Faux Pas Detective

This activity is designed to develop students' intercultural awareness and communication skills in a global context. It is ideal for students at B2 level and above, particularly those preparing to enter international workplaces or study abroad.

Objective

To help students identify, understand, and reflect on intercultural misunderstandings through real-life inspired scenarios. The focus is on critical thinking, empathy, and respectful communication across cultures.

How to Use the Cards

Here are a few ways to implement the cards in class:

- 1. 1. Group Work & Discussion
- Divide students into small groups.
 - Give each group one card (or let them choose one randomly).
 - Ask them to read the situation, identify the faux pas, discuss what went wrong and how it could be handled better.
 - Groups can present their findings to the class.
- 2. 2. Role-play / Mini Skits
- Students act out the situation in pairs or groups.
 - After each skit, the class discusses the cultural misunderstanding and possible alternatives.
 - This can be expanded into a drama-based lesson or speaking assessment.
- 3. 3. Writing Extension
- After the discussion, ask students to write an email or dialogue correcting the situation or explaining it politely.
 - Great for practicing formal/informal tone and intercultural sensitivity in written communication.
- 4. 4. Cultural Reflection
- Invite students to share any real-life experiences of cultural misunderstandings.
 - Encourage them to reflect: What would they do differently now?

Teaching Tips

- Encourage open-mindedness and remind students there are no 'wrong' reactions just different cultural lenses.
- Use the commentary document to provide cultural context or clarify misconceptions.
- Allow time for debriefing students may have emotional or personal reactions.
- Use online tools like Padlet or Jamboard for collaborative notes or visual reflections.
- Adapt scenarios to the students' study/work goals (e.g. Erasmus, international job interviews, intercultural teams).

Outcomes

By the end of the lesson, students should be able to:

- recognize the complexity of intercultural communication,
- explain how misunderstandings may occur,
- apply respectful and adaptable communication strategies in future encounters.

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
